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Course Description

Reading Strategies is a yearlong course designed to strengthen reading comprehension and fluency through the use of context clues, skimming/scanning, paraphrasing and summarizing, and practice and drill. The goal of the class is to enhance students' reading skills while building their confidence in their abilities.

We will work on a variety of assignments during the class and will utilize the iPads. Students are expected to bring their iPads to class each day. Assignments will be posted on eBackpack. We will read different types of content during class- both out loud and independently. If there is something you are really interested in reading, please let me know! I love to hear what students are interested in. I will track student progress through various assessments- curriculum-based, formative and summative. The grading scale is as follows:

Students who are legally absent for the entire school day will be given an opportunity to make up all work missed. All work must be completed within a time period not to exceed the number of school days the student was absent. Students who fail to submit a written parental excuse within three school days following an absence will be marked as unexcused. Students who have received an excused absence or tardy will be permitted to make up any classwork missed during their absence; students receiving an unexcused/unlawful absence will not be permitted to make up assigned work for the time absent.

Each day we will begin class by completing a bell ringer. These activities will vary from week to week and result in a cumulative grade at the end of the nine-week grading period. Please check the grade book periodically and ask me about any questions or concerns you may have.
