Welcome to English 11! Below are a few suggestions to help you make the most of this course.

Topics to be covered

In this course, we will study American Literature by theme while focusing on the unique traits of the writing styles of the authors and poets of different literary periods and looking at the historical influences of the periods on the literature. We will use our textbook, *Elements of Literature Fifth Course*, as our primary source but will also study additional longer works as well. These longer works may include, *The Crucible* by Arthur Miller, *The Great Gatsby* by F. Scott Fitzgerald, and *Of Mice and Men* by John Steinbeck, and *Tuesdays With Morrie* by Mitch Albom. In addition to these, you will each choose one additional novel from a provided list that you will read and analyze in your American author research paper.

Materials Needed Daily for Class

- Three-ring binder (containing materials for this class only) with dividers
- Pencil or pen
- Book or novel (whichever we are using at the time)
- Homework
- iPad

Course Binder

You must keep all notes, handouts, and homework in your binder for each nine weeks. I may collect your binder for points once each nine weeks. At the end of each nine weeks period you may remove some materials from your binder if needed, but put them in a safe place as they may be needed for tests, a mid-term, and / or a final exam later in the course. When absent, you must obtain copies of all notes that you missed. Specific binder directions will be provided on a separate direction sheet.

Hall Travel

You will not be permitted to go to any location during class, except the restroom and only when it is an emergency. In order to be dismissed to the restroom, you must have a pass from me. Bring all materials to class when you arrive, as you will not be permitted to retrieve them from your locker after class begins.

Classroom Behavior

This is a high school course designed to prepare you for higher education, vocational training, and the world of work; therefore, it is expected that you will behave like young adults. You must respect all parties in the room including the teacher, your classmates, administrators, and guests. Inappropriate behavior is defined as anything that disrespects someone else in the classroom or disrupts the learning process. Inappropriate behavior will be dealt with in the following manner. 1) verbal warning, 2) detention and phone call home 3) referral to office.

In addition, please respect the following BRAVE standards of behavior:

- Be safe: Listen to staff and maintain personal space.
- Respect others: Be on time, be polite, and use appropriate language and tone.
- Be accountable: Be prepared, be honest, do your own work, use electronic devices only when permitted.
- Be victorious: Do your best work and celebrate academic success.
- Be enthusiastic: Have a positive attitude and take ownership of learning.

Attendance

- Excused tardy / absence
 - Work made up in amount of days missed
 - Get work in advance when possible
 - This includes days missed for school activities
- Unexcused tardy / absence / class cut
 - No credit for work completed on that day – including participation points
 - Class cuts also receive disciplinary action
- Late to Class
 - Three unexcused = detention after school with me

Tardy To School / Early Dismissal / Field Trip

If you come to school late, leave early, or attend a field trip, you are in the school building and are expected to deliver any homework due that day to me that day. You may do this by delivering the assignment directly to me or having the main office secretaries place it securely in my mailbox. You may also leave it in the English basket in my classroom. Please ask for work in advance when possible, as I am often prepared weeks or months ahead of schedule.

Tests and Quizzes

Tests and quizzes may be given online via Canvas. When they are given in this format, **YOU ARE NOT PERMITTED TO TAKE THEM ON ANY ELECTRONIC DEVICE OTHER THAN YOUR SCHOOL ISSUED IPAD.** Any student who does not have a charged, district-issued iPad in class during the test will take the make-up form on paper. Phones or other personal devices will not be permitted. Students are not permitted to share the quiz password with any students in other classes or at home. This will be considered a violation of academic integrity. Any student absent the day of the quiz or test will also take the paper make-up. This test will be an equivalent to the original test given in class, but may not be in the same format or have the same questions.

Academic Integrity - Plagiarism and Cheating

It is absolutely unacceptable to copy material from another student or from another source (i.e.: internet sites). You are not permitted to “work together” on homework assignments unless I have given you specific permission to do so. If you are found plagiarizing work or cheating in any way, you and any other student (s) involved will receive a zero on the assignment, project, or test. Texting or using other electronic devices during tests or quizzes will also result in a zero. This includes sending quiz codes to your peers in other classes or at home. You will NOT have the opportunity to make up the work or do the assignment again. This includes all assignments and compositions - no exceptions. This is pursuant to the district policy. In addition, please keep the following in mind:
* Accurately cite all sources.
* Accurately represent your sources

- * Read all assigned readings to assure accuracy
- * Do not copy another person’s work
- * Do not give your work to others

- * Proofread your work to assure accuracy
- * Include a list of works cited for all compositions
- * Do not download a composition from the internet
- * Do not make up quotes that are not in the text you have read
- * Do not write a paper for one course and turn the same paper in for another course

Cell Phone / Electronics Policy

From 7:10 a.m. to 2:20 p.m., PED’s are permitted to be used during transitional times in the halls, common areas, cafeteria, Media Center, and study halls, **AND AT TEACHER DISCRETION FOR INSTRUCTIONAL PURPOSES IN THE CLASSROOMS.** This privilege may be restricted or revoked at any time pursuant to a disciplinary violation, and as directed by a staff member or building administration.

This is part of the district policy regarding cell phones and electronic devices that applies to the classroom. If you are caught using a cell phone during class, I will confiscate it and provide you with a detention for insubordinate behavior. Please observe this policy. It is inappropriate to use a cell phone when you are expected to be doing academic work. It is unprofessional and absolutely rude to use a cell phone while the teacher or another classmate is talking. Courtesy is required in this classroom. In addition, all iPads and other devices should be powered off and placed under the desk unless you are directed to use them. Ear buds and headphones should also be removed. Violations of this policy in my room will result in disciplinary action where necessary.

Participation

Appropriate participation in class is expected. Appropriate participation includes, but is not limited to: bringing all necessary materials to class each day (book, writing utensil, binder, etc.), participating in class by raising your hand and providing appropriate commentary and/or answers to discussion questions, being alert and attentive as you take notes and following discussions and lectures in class. The following activities are not appropriate in class: sleeping, putting your head on your desk, acting out in any way that disrupts the learning process, and not working on appropriate, course-related activities. I do keep track of these activities daily.

Grading

Grades are not given in this course. They are earned through your hard work. All grading will be done according to the district’s grading scale. Each assignment will have an assigned point value. Check your grades frequently online. See the guidance office if you do not have a password for PowerSchool.

Homework / Assignment Standards

All work must be completed on time. Late work will be accepted for two days after the due date at a cost of 50% of the points. This includes work late for the following reasons: printer out of ink, work forgotten at home or elsewhere, work not completed due to after school job, activity, or other extracurricular responsibility. All work should be neatly written or typed (if required). Use blue or black ink pen or pencil when necessary. All work should be completed on 8 1/2 by 11 sheets of lined paper. MLA Style must be used. 10 % will be deducted

from work not meeting these standards. 10% will also be deducted from any assignment turned in without the provided grading rubric. 10% will also be deducted from papers that do not include your name or MLA heading where appropriate..

Success In This Course

According to district policy, you must receive a cumulative percentage of 60 in order to pass this course and you must pass one of the two final nine weeks regardless of your final percentage. Effort goes a long way in this course. Attending school regularly, keeping up with all notes, readings, and assignments, and asking for help when needed will ensure your success.


